The City has approved and seen (or will soon see) the construction of hundreds of thousands of square feet of commercial office and retail uses; hundreds of housing units; a private high school; a private elementary school; a privately owned, open-to the public community center, and; a new government center. But what about traffic? What is being done to prepare the City to handle the additional vehicle loads? How is it done? Who does it? And what is being done to monitor and improve traffic conditions outside of the City, in the general region?
