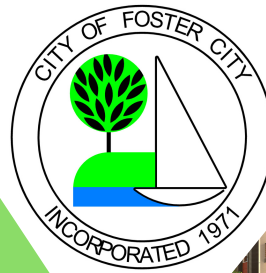


HOUSING RESOURCES FOR THOSE WITH DISABILITIES

HUD provides information on Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended. This law often is called simply "Section 504." Other federal laws that provide nondiscrimination on the basis of disability include the Fair Housing Act, the Americans with Disabilities Act, and the Architectural Barriers Act.

In-Home Support Services

The IHSS Program will help pay for services provided to you so that you can remain safely in your own home. To be eligible, you must be 65 year of age and over, or disabled, or blind. Disabled children are also potentially eligible for IHSS. IHSS is considered an alternative to out-of-home care, such as nursing homes or board and care facilities.
