MUTUAL AID RESPONSE MFF

♦ The Mobile Field Force (MFF) is an organized response to a request for mutual aid

♦ Similar to the development of the fire service's concept of a "Strike Team"

 Regionally organized, trained and equipped group of officers/deputies from a coalition of independent agencies that may be deployed as needed

MUTUAL AID RESPONSE MFF

The Mobile Field Force is used to mitigate potential or real problems

An effective method for assembling and deploying a platoon sized tactical force for mutual aid missions within the state of California



MOBILE FIELD FORCE

♦ A platoon sized tactical force from different counties

Will respond to the requesting agencies area as a tactical force to support the Incident Commander



WBMFF CONCEPT

- Rapid, Organized and Disciplined Response
- MFF OIC (Lieutenant) directs the MFF
- Subordinate to the Incident Commander
- Operates in a platoon strength
- CBRNE-Chemical, biological, radiological, and nuclear (Level "C" PPE) capability

ACTIVATION OF WBMFF

WBMFF should be made available for response in the event of a natural disaster, civil unrest, or other major incidents, when:

- ♦ All available resources in the affected jurisdiction have been reasonably depleted and;
- ♦ The normal delivery of police services has been significantly disrupted

WBMFF STAGING AREA

You will typically be asked the following when arriving at the requesting Agencies staging area:

- How many officers/deputies did you bring?
- How many vehicles do you have?
- What are your hours of operation?
- ♦ What munitions did you bring? (ERIW, Chem Agents, TASER)



WBMFF STAGING AREA

You should ask the following when arriving at the requesting Agencies staging area:

- ♦ What is our mission?
- Are we going to be deployed with another agency?
- ♦ Rules of engagement? (Can we use chemical agents, Less Lethal munitions, Flash Bangs, Tasers, etc.)
- Who is going to be our pathfinder?

- ♦ Duty Belt w/all safety equipment
- ♦ Riot/Ballistic Helmet
- ♦ 36" Baton
- ♦ 24" Baton (optional)
- ♦ ASP Baton (if Dept. certified)
- Flashlight
- ♦ Gas Mask (APR) Air Purifying Respirator
- ♦ Handgun
- Body Armor





MRMEL EOMBINENT,

- ♦ Riot Shield(s)
- Riot gear (shin guards, elbow pads, helmet, chest protector)
- Handcuffs or Flex Cuffs
- Police/Sheriff Line yellow tape

- Less Lethal Munitions
- ♦ Level "C" PPE
- APR Canisters
- ♦ TASER
- ♦ First Aid Kit
