Shoplifters With Replica Gun, Arrested For Robbery

On May 29, 2020, at 7:38 p.m., Foster City Police Department Officers responded to 919 Edgewater Boulevard, the Lucky Supermarket, on a report of shoplifting and brandishing of a weapon. The Lucky's Store Manager reported that a female suspect stole a shopping cart full of over \$600.00 worth of items without paying. The female took the stolen goods to a waiting vehicle. A Lucky's employee followed the female in an attempt to confront her when a male suspect exited the waiting vehicle while holding a black semi-automatic handgun against his waist. With the weapon at his side pointed downward, the male suspect told the employee that he should leave. The employee feared for his safety and returned to the store while the suspects left the scene. The reporting party provided a detailed description of the suspects and vehicle.

Minutes later, FCPD Officers located the suspect's vehicle less than a mile away traveling along Pitcairn Drive near Edgewater Boulevard. Officers initiated a felony car stop on northbound Edgewater Boulevard at Boothbay Ave. Both suspects were detained without incident. A BB gun resembling a replica black semi-automatic pistol, a small amount of heroin, drug paraphernalia, and the stolen goods were all located during a probable cause search of the vehicle. Witnesses identified the two detained subjects as the suspects who committed the crimes.

Booked into the San Mateo County Jail and charged with felony robbery, conspiracy to commit a crime, and drug possession, was 31-year old Oakland resident, Antonio Jamerson. 32-year old Daly City resident, Adrienne Angeles, was booked into the San Mateo County Jail for robbery and conspiracy to commit a crime.

The Foster City Police Department would like to stress the importance of reporting crimes in a safe and timely manner. Providing detailed information such as suspect or vehicle description, direction of travel, often aids officers locating and arresting the suspects. We would like to remind everyone that when reporting an incident or a crime to please provide as many specific details as possible and to expect our dispatchers to ask a series of follow-up questions to get additional details.
