## HERE ARE THE STEPS TO GET STARTED

### 1. ACCESS YOUR ACCOUNT

Most HOAs and commercial customers already have an account – check if yours is included using the “find your site” feature on: [www.waterflurence.com](http://www.waterflurence.com).

If your HOA is not included or you don't have access, please use the “Contact Us” feature to get started.

### 2. ADD YOUR LANDSCAPER CONTACT

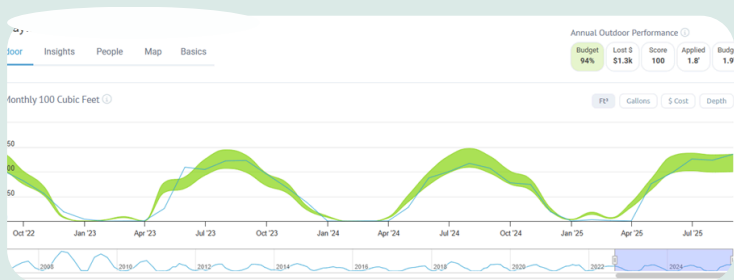
Once your account is activated, you will receive log in information via email.

Adding your landscape contractor is the number one most impactful step you can take to help improve irrigation efficiency. It is highly likely your landscaper is already using our program. Add your landscaper by navigating to the “People” tab on your dashboard.

Waterflurence sends notifications about leaks alerts, high month alerts, new water billing data posts, and important information regarding landscape field surveys and water regulations.

### 3. CHECK YOUR BUDGET AND INSIGHTS

See how your site is performing compared to your allocated water budget. Your water budget is determined based on estimates of irrigated area, plant types, irrigation system characteristics, and real-time local weather. Waterflurence continually analyzes water use against budget and provides tailored recommendations to improve efficiency.



### 4. REVIEW NONFUNCTIONAL TURF

Waterflurence is assisting irrigation customers in identifying nonfunctional turf to help comply with California Assembly Bill 1572. Use the map tool to identify non-functional turf.

California's [Assembly Bill 1572](#), signed in 2023, phases in a prohibition on using potable (drinking) water to irrigate nonfunctional turf on commercial, industrial, and institutional properties (CII).
